The exterior will also be in keeping with the rest of the house in terms of brickwork, and existing windows be painted to match the new ones.

## Come Along To The Oaks Summer Fete! Saturday 20th August

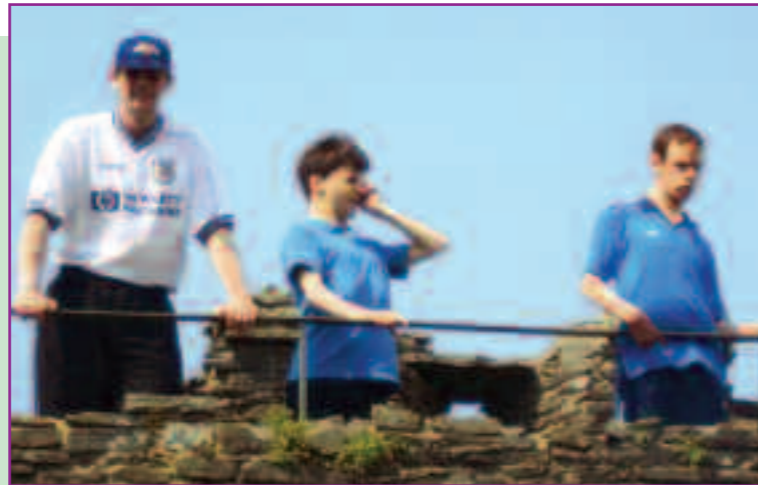

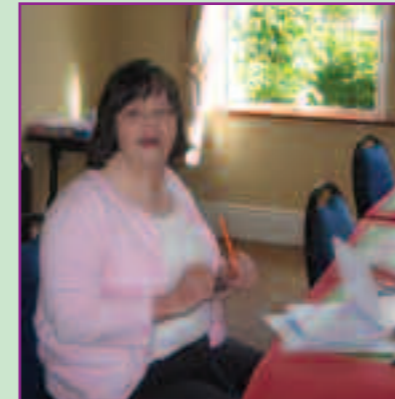
